Please note when dropping off your child at the nursery, we kindly ask for your help in contributing recyclable items. Please ensure they are free of sharp objects. Your support will enhance our learning environment and promote sustainability.

### It is very important that parents understand the funding process:

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- 1. A parent must have a valid eligibility code for the term they are applying for funding. Codes must be requested PRIOR to the start of a term. If a code is applied for during a term it will only be valid the following term;
- 2. It is the responsibility of the parents to make sure they have **valid codes** in place for each term and not the Nursery;
- 3. Please note the below table as to when a child is entitled to funding. Just because they have a code have turned 2 or 3 does not mean they are entitled to funding;
- 4. The attached parent declaration needs to be completed each term by all the eligible parents. A few parents have failed to complete the funding form especially the national insurance number and copy of the child's passport.
- 5. The child must be present during headcount week each term. If they are not present, their funding may be withdrawn / adjusted by Harrow Council
- 6. If a child starts part-term from another nursery, we need to confirm how many hours have already been claimed for. We then need to apply to Harrow Council for the additional funding.
- 7. The council provides funding for 30 hours per week for 38 weeks of the year (during school term time). We are open for 45 hours a week and 51 weeks a year. Therefore, the funding is applicable between the months of September to July.
- 8. Please keep yourselves up to date with the latest updates and funding from HMRC and Harrow Council website new funding i.e. 9 months and 2 years old funding.

# News from the Governors

Thank you to the parents who were able to attend the coffee evening. We had nineteen parents and had a constructive session.

Please let the manager know if you are interested in having an afterschool club that would run from 5:00-6:00pm. This can only happen if we have enough children, staff and is self-funded.

We would like to remind the parents that it's paramount that children are dropped off in the nursery before 9:00am and picked up after 4:00pm. This would enable a smoother running and establish routine for the children. Lateness disrupts the staff and most importantly children lose out on the carpet time which prepares them for the day. Staff will not provide breakfast if a child is late. Consistent lateness may lead to your child losing a place at the nursery.

In addition, we cannot cater for different dietary requirement unless a child has a medical or food allergies/intolerant; hence the menu.

Although we have had £50 administration fees for late fees payment, we have been generous to the parents. However, if parents are consistently late in paying the monthly fees on time or have more than one month's fees outstanding, we will add this amount in the statement.
